CURRICULUM

The basic purpose of education is to train a human being, so that he or she will be able to solve problems with confidence and ingenuity. Especially so when problems are inevitable. Every human being exists in three worlds.

The first world is the intellectual destiny. In which one tries to discover the laws of universal harmony, and arrive of different mental images. In the second world, the social destiny, one tries to harmonize with the moral world. The images that one forms from this world is what makes one act and behave in the society. The third world is the industrial world. By creating an environment that fulfills the needs of the other two worlds.

But these three worlds of human being are not stagnant. They are interdependent. They move in time and space with a certain relativity amongst themselves. And it is the degree of this relativity that results in changes and utlimately progress.

SID's task is to develop these three worlds within the students in a most effective way. So that when they graduate from SID, they would be individuals whose intellectual, social and industrial worlds are in harmony. Individuals whose three worlds move and change along with time and space so that they can foresee, predict and after their paths. And individuals who can inject new force into any of the three worlds to create environments according to the needs of today and tomorrow. The curriculum is a frame work for imparting knowledge. A diagram in which the relationship between disciplines are made apparent. The very structure of the curriculum states the point of view which should permeate across all teaching & learning. That the aim of education is to nourish a mind that comprehends relationships both methodical & imaginative ways.

The aim of design of interior spaces should be enhancement of the spiritual, mental, emotional & physical well being of man & improvement of his functional efficiency. Use of materials & technology appropriate to the task & physical socio-cultural environment should be the approach. Respect to our esthetic & cultural traditions & heritage should be the 'pramana' & not the glossy imported magazines.

SID's curriculum; academic philosophy, directions & attitudes are derived from the following:-

- (a) The designer should be deeply aware of traditional cultural & ethnic moorings (roots) of the society within which he operates. he should be able to operate in the modern milieu, understand its problems & aspirations.
- (b) The designer should respond to the psychological needs & perceptions of the people for whom he works. & he should sensitively, with a sense of discretion & discrimination use products, materials, processes & artifacts, ranging from the traditional to the modern, harmoniously blended.
- (c) The designer of the interior spaces should treat related disciplines of architectural design & building technology with due consideration to create a harmonious environment. He should have aesthetic sensitivity to create interior spaces that are aesthetically pleasing & satisfying.
- (d) The interior designer is a practitioner of his profession, & he should discharge his professional responsibilities competently, in addition to his design responsibilities.
- (e) He shall utilize his training, knowledge & experience, both as a professional & as a concerned member of the society, for making a better place to live.

The canvas for Interior Design education is indeed very wide as it should cover art, architecture, technology, products of all kinds, furniture, professional practice, humanities, social sciences, cultural anthropology, etc.

The firsts two years are devoted to exposure to related areas of interior design foundation years. The third year is for assimilation & integration. Then follows practical training for one summer & seventh semester. Specialized areas of Interior Design are dealt with in the fourth year. Exposure to research areas is done in the fifth year culminating in a research thesis.

Sound knowledge of folk art forms, craft forms, materials, products & technology are emphasised through various workshop programmes, field trips, site visits, related study programmes, summer placement & practical training programmes - formally & informally blended through teaching & non-teaching areas. Some programmes, particularly elective courses & related studies are conducted with other schools on the campus, as well as the National Institute of Design which is located in Ahmedabad.
