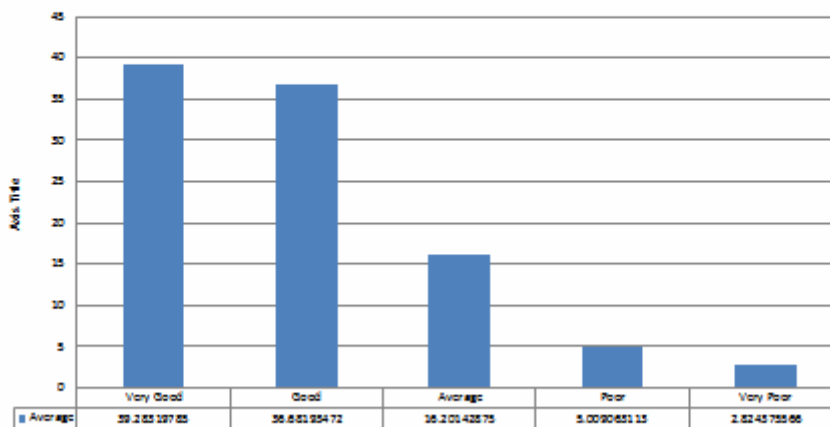

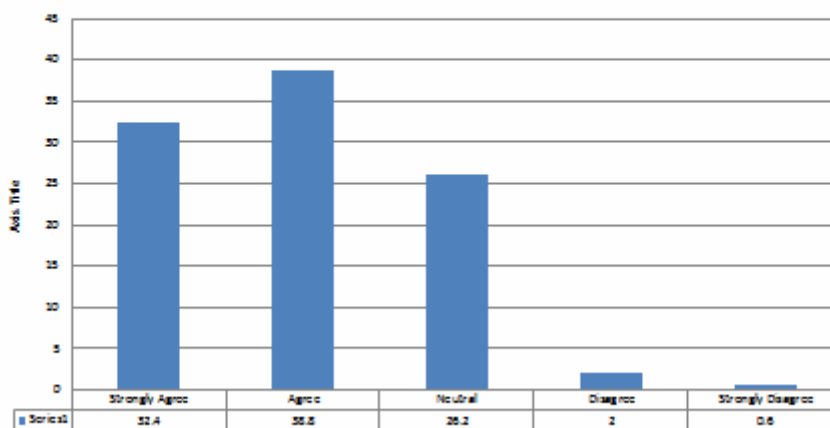


Student Feedback April 2013

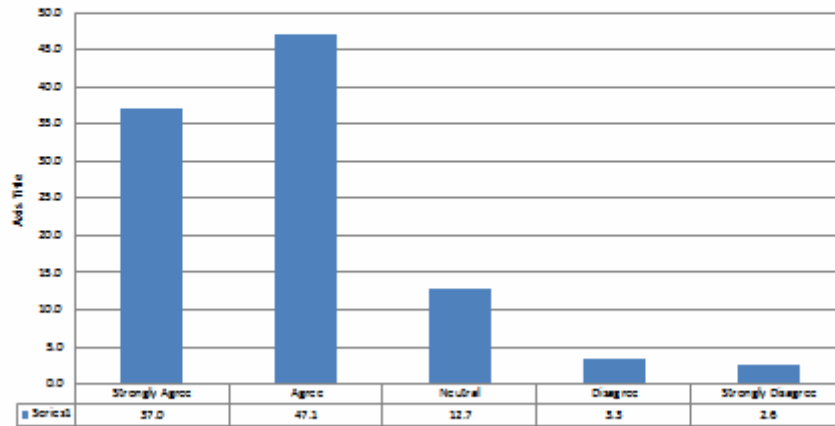
Feedback from Parents April 2013

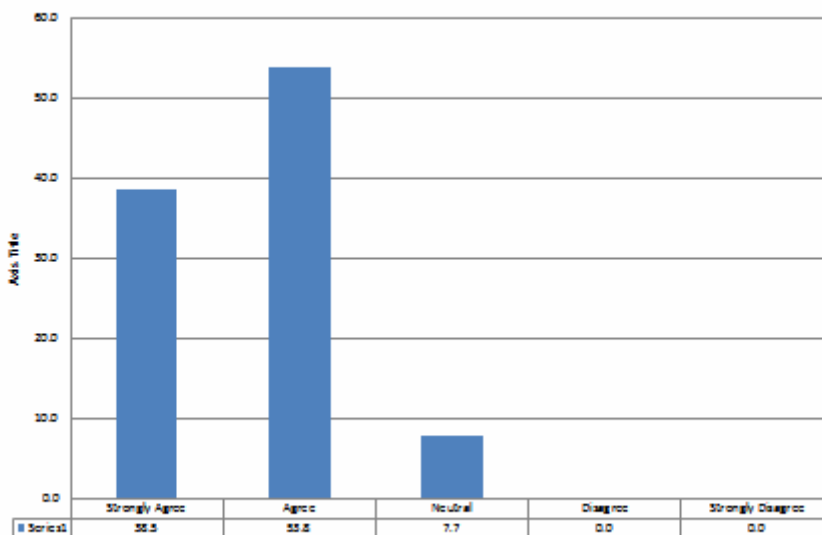


Feedback from Alumni April 2013
